



MEET VELDA – LOCAL STYLE ICON, ENTREPRENEUR AND BLOGGER, WHO RECENTLY ADDED THE GARNISH OF RESTAURATEUR TO HER CAP. SHE SHARES THE BEST OF SINGAPORE SHOPPING AND DINING.

Co-founder of fashion label Love, Bonito and creative force behind hip new lobster shack Pince & Pints in the trendy Duxton Hill area, Velda is a maven of shopping and dining in Singapore. A wallflower, so she says, but we know otherwise about this serene, inspiring and beloved girl about town.

Singapore's best-kept secret is... Capella Hotel. It's a great place to get away from the bustle of city life without having to cross borders. An even better kept secret would be Bob's Bar – the hotel's lounge that overlooks lush greenery and is discreetly tucked away. It's the perfect place for catching sunset and some pre-dinner cocktails.

The dining scene here is... diverse and multicultural. We Singaporeans are spoilt for choice when it comes to the variety of cuisine offered in our city. I particularly love the idea of being able to choose between *roti prata* (South Indian flat bread) or *Teochew porridge* (porridge with small dishes) at any time in the day, even for supper at 3am! Some of my favourite supper spots include PS.Cafe on Ann Siang Hill, and Fordham & Grand bar on Craig Road, both of which

Local designers are... gaining traction because our community values creativity and is becoming more supportive of local-grown brands. This is not only seen in the fashion industry, but also in the arts and dining scene.

Singapore Fashion Week... this May will be extra special since it's the first year under the new moniker, bringing it in line with the big four fashion weeks of the world. I'm super excited that Diane von Furstenberg will open the show and participate in a series of industry talks and sessions organised in collaboration with LASALLE College of the Arts. This demonstrates deep support of local designers. I will be launching my new fashion label there as well. Squeal!

I'm excited about... the SG50 celebrations as our country commemorates its Jubilee Year! There really is no better time to visit Singapore than this year – with many great activities planned for locals and tourists to enjoy, and it's also a time for us to just reflect on our identity as a nation.

open till 2am. The Black Swan in the central business district has a special supper menu, and Maxwell Food Centre does a gorgeous Cantonese porridge till 2.30am.

No-one should leave Singapore without... a meal at Makansutra Gluttons Bay or one of our hawker centres. They're the best way to get a taste of local delights like chilli crab, *satay* (grilled meat skewers), *char kway teow* (stir-fried rice noodles), and oyster omelette. Best to order up big and share plates.

When the Great Singapore Sale (GSS) hits town, I can be seen... shopping online because it's way too crowded to hit the streets! What's unique about the GSS is the sales are

Appetising April

In a food-loving Singapore, there's never a shortage of exciting dinners, festivals and parties surrounding the culinary scene. But for foodies exploring Singapore's gastronomical offerings in April, you're in luck: two major food-centric events are set to take place – namely the World Street Food Congress (April 8 to 12), and the World Gourmet Summit (April 6 to May 3).

Now in its second year, the **World Street Food Congress** (WSFC) pays homage to the wonderful world of street food, focusing on Singapore as well as other iconic foodie nations. Even celebrity chef and TV personality Anthony Bourdain has graced the WSFC!

Organised by Makansutra – one of Singapore's leading food

guides – the idea behind WSFC is to raise awareness about the importance of preserving street food cultures, especially in a place like Singapore, where modern eateries and younger, "office-inclined" generations are contributing to the gradual disappearance of the vibrant hawker scene. With the 2015 theme set as 'Empower, Engage and Opportunities', the five-day event will feature a smorgasbord of hawker stalls (and recipes), chef demonstrations, networking activities, and dialogue sessions led by key players in the F&B industry. The WSFC will be held in an open-area in Bugis (the grassland next to Tan Quee Lan Street).

The **World Gourmet Summit** (WGS) sits on the other end of the spectrum. This annual fine-

dining celebration takes place across a number of Singapore's upscale restaurants and focuses on the crème de la crème of the food world, from extravagant plates to highly prized wines.

Guest appearances by celebrity chefs and Michelin-starred talents are part of the WGS traditions, and past year culinary heavyweights include British restaurateur Marco Pierre White and German chef Thomas Bühner. Dinner collaborations between overseas and local chefs, cooking workshops and demonstrations, wine tasting sessions, table luncheons – expect all these and more during the prestigious event.

Experience the most visionary and progressive of local, Asian and international fashion at this showcase, which consists of four pillar events, namely Singapore Fashion Week, BLUEPRINT, a

fashion competition, and Asia Fashion Summit.

It's also one of the first fashion festivals in the world to introduce the public to traditionally by-invite-only shows. Everyone is welcome, though tickets to the big-name showcases sell out quickly. Top international designers, models and celebrities including Prabal Gurung, Oscar De La Renta, Erin O'Connor, and Kate Bosworth graced the festival last year, but the spotlight is also on Asia's top talents and Singapore's brightest stars.

Of course, no fashion week is complete without glitzy after-parties – don't leave them out of your fashion-filled itinerary!



There's so much to see and do here in **Holland Village**; there are Indian, Chinese, Japanese restaurants, spa places, bakeries, bars – it's a very unique neighbourhood and that's what I love about Holland Village.

A lot of people only visit the ground level shops in Holland Village. Many aren't aware that there are more shops on the second level of these buildings! For example, if you walk up the flight of stairs beside El Patio Mexican Restaurant & Wine Bar (34 Lorong Mambong), you'll find a spot where you can do your eyebrows (Rupini's, 34A Lorong Mambong) and get cupcakes (Plain Vanilla, 34A Lorong Mambong).

I like to go to Holland Village Market & Food Centre (1 Lorong Mambong) for local dishes like minced pork *mee pok* (flat yellow egg noodles). Over at Chip Bee Gardens, there's Original Sin (#01-62, 43 Jalan Merah Saga), a vegetarian Mediterranean restaurant that I love – it's been around for ages.

Food and drink aside, you have to come here for a spa treatment. There's Qi Mantra (18A

Lorong Mambong), My Happy Feet (21A Lorong Mambong)... for a small enclave like Holland Village, there are about five or six choices, which is pretty amazing!

For a dessert with local flavour, pop by 2am:dessertbar for Shades of Green, which consists of a pistachio sponge, coco mousse, and *pandan gula melaka* (palm sugar) custard.

If you're spending a day in Holland Village, start with a *dim sum* (Cantonese-style bite-sized food) breakfast at Crystal Jade Kitchen (2 Lorong Mambong). In the afternoon, get a massage, then walk over to Chip Bee Gardens for a nice cup of coffee at the new Monocle Café (74 Jalan Kelabu Asap, pictured above). For dinner, pick one of the many *ramen* (Japanese soup noodles) outlets for Japanese fare. Then, hit up Wala Wala Café Bar (31 Lorong Mambong) for great live music and post-dinner drinks.

Take note that Customs will not process the tax claim forms if the goods are not presented for inspection.
